COMMUNITY IMPACT & BENEFIT

FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

We believe that all kids deserve the opportunity to discover who they are and what they can achieve. Through the Y, thousands of Milwaukee area youth are cultivating the values, skills and relationships that lead to positive behaviors, better health and educational achievement.

500 TEENS High school students, primarily from Milwaukee Public Schools, participate in Sponsor-A-Scholar and Black Achievers. The programs' graduation rate is an astounding 98.7 percent from high school and 52.8 percent graduation rate from post-secondary education – a 22 percent increase over the national average.

510 STUDENTS Students enrolled in our YMCA Young Leaders Academy charter school are provided with a high quality academic learning experience as they prepare for high school, college and beyond.

1,311 KIDS Kids are enrolled in Child Care, Early Education and After School programs that enable them to gain self-confidence, learn socialization skills, develop into leaders and begin their educational experience in a safe and enriching environment.

5,350 CAMPERS Y resident camps, Camp Minikani and Camp Matawa, along with Y Day Camps provide the opportunity for kids to discover who they are and what they can achieve. Kids return to camp each year to build on leadership skills, handle new responsibilities, make new friends and create memories that last a lifetime.

\$331,000 In scholarships and subsidies for children and teens who attend Y day and resident camps.

FOR HEALTHY LIVING

With a mission centered on balance, the Y brings individuals and families closer together while fostering connections through health and wellness programs. Thousands of youth, adults and families receive the support, guidance and resources needed to achieve greater health and well-being.

97% The total number of members surveyed who say that the Y makes it convenient to adopt a healthy lifestyle through its programs and classes.

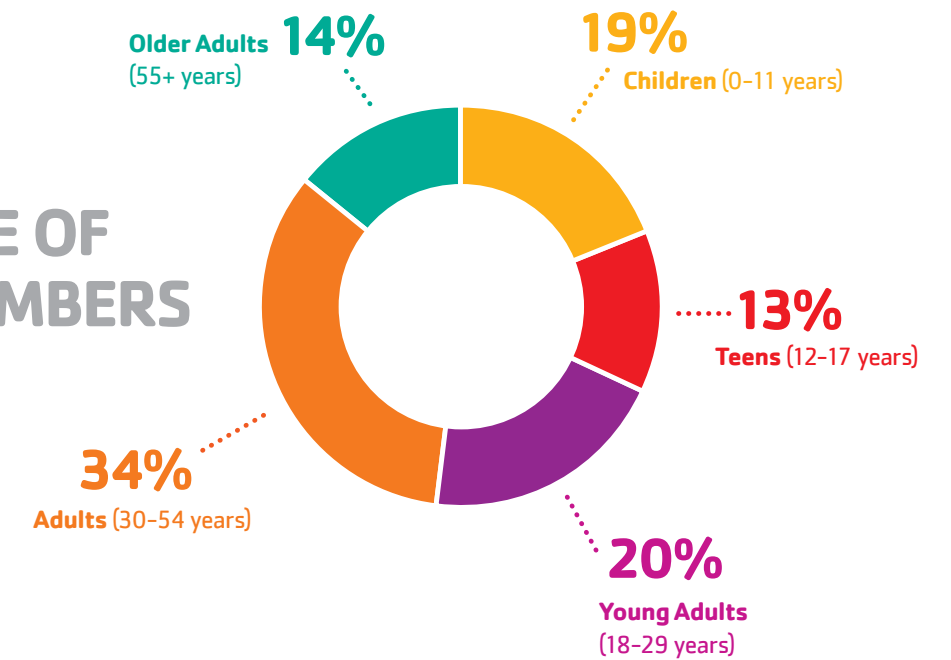
7,161 HOURS Serving more than 350 members, Y personal trainers provided 7,161 hours to guide and support people on their journey to a healthier lifestyle.

\$680,000 Program scholarships totaled more than half a million dollars, and as a result, thousands of youth, families, adults and seniors received the opportunity to participate in Y programming such as preschool classes, youth sports, aquatics and more.

\$1.2 MILLION In 2010, 8,797 memberships were subsidized by more than \$1.2 million in membership assistance. As a result, thousands of people received the opportunity to participate in Y programming and receive all that the Y has to offer its members.

\$2.2 MILLION Program subsidies represent the Y's mission to provide access for all. More than \$2.2 million in expenses is absorbed by the Y to ensure that programs are affordable for all those who wish to participate.

We believe in giving back and supporting our neighbors. For more than 152 years, the Y has been listening and responding to the Milwaukee communities' needs.

4 COUNTIES The YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee reaches across four counties (Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Waukesha and Washington) and serves as a community resource to more than 112,000 children, families, adults and seniors.

200 WOMEN A growing group of Islamic women have taken advantage of a private swim program offered exclusively after regularly scheduled center hours to honor the women's religious integrity. The women feel safe, respected and comfortable knowing their religious needs are being met, while staying active and healthy.

800 STUDENTS Drowning is the second leading cause of accidental death for children between the ages of 1-14. The Y is partnering with area schools to combat this staggering statistic with SPLASH – a program that teaches more than 800 second grade students how to swim each year.

888 VOLUNTEERS In 2010, the Y was supported by program and policy volunteers, who enable the Y to deliver on its mission and cause to reach even further into surrounding communities.

\$700,000 In 2010, the YMCA Community Development Center provided low-income residents with financial assistance for 40 minor home repairs and 28 rehabilitation projects, averaging more than \$25,000 per home.

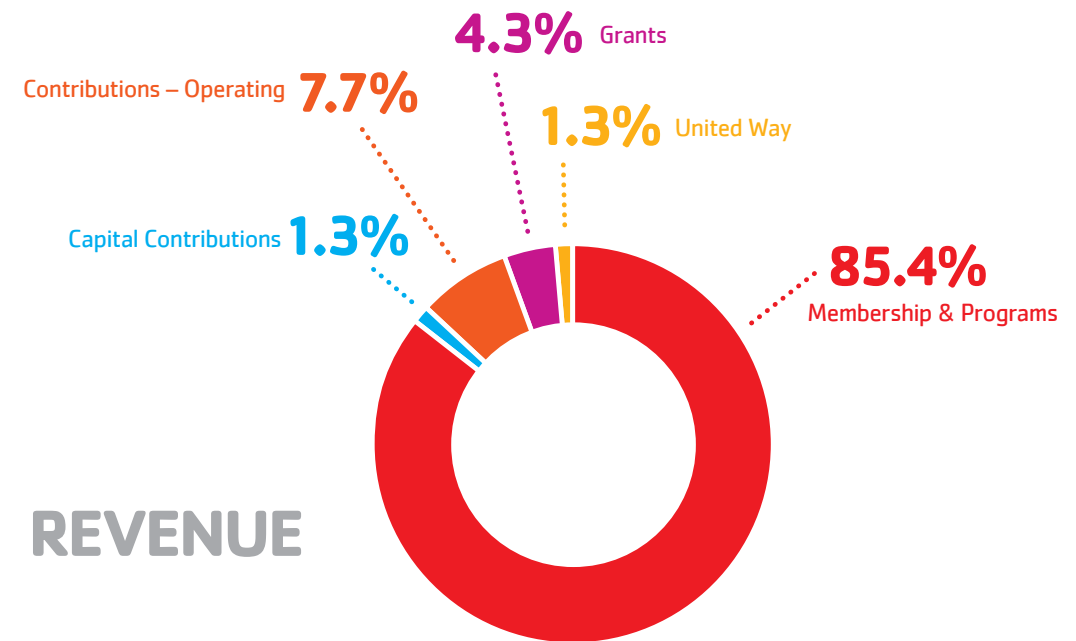

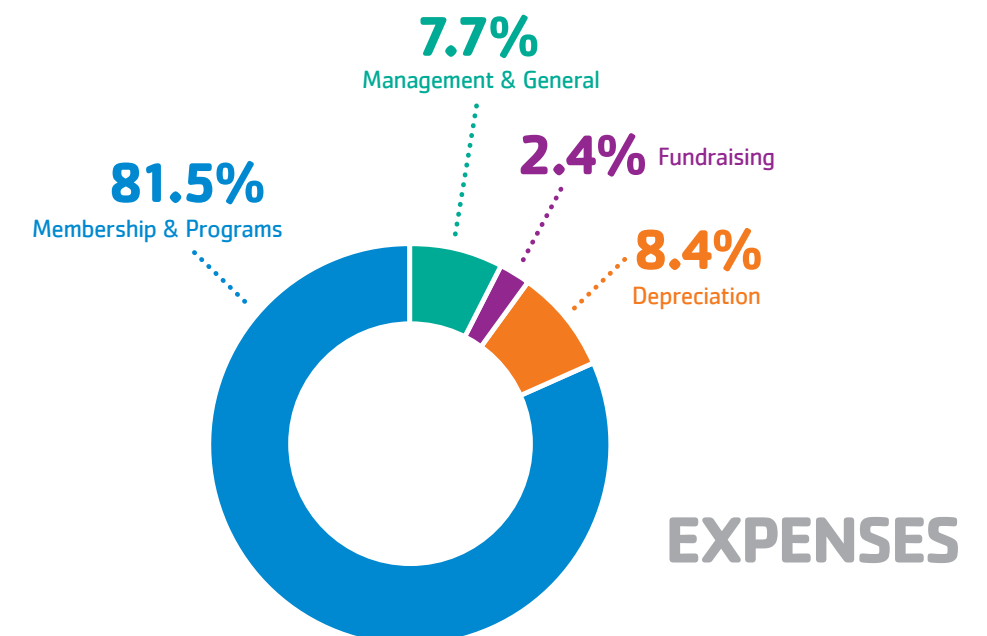
